

Cleaning Instructions for Textile Wallcovering

When cleaning your textile wallcovering, always handle stains with care to maintain its quality. Follow these steps carefully:

1. Stay Calm

For challenging stains such as mud, ketchup, lipstick, or modelling clay, start by removing any residue with the edge of a teaspoon. Gently scrape off the excess without pressing too hard.

For stains like ink or coffee, you can skip this step.

2. Blot with Water

Use a sheet of kitchen paper or a clean cloth and dampen it slightly with clean water. Remember, the wallcovering has a non-woven paper base and is laminated with a water-based glue, so avoid soaking it.

Blot the stain gently—do not rub in circular motions, as this can cause the kitchen paper to tear and leave fibers on the fabric. Rinse and repeat until no stain transfers to the paper.

3. Use Soap if Necessary

If the stain persists, dampen a microfiber cloth with water and apply a small amount of household soap. This works well for oil-based stains. With the microfiber cloth, you can gently rub in circular motions to lift the stain. Repeat the process as needed until the stain is completely gone.

4. Let It Air Dry

Allow the area to air dry naturally. Do not use a hairdryer or apply heat, as this can damage the material. Patience is key—air drying is the safest method.

By following these steps, your textile wallcovering will remain clean and intact without compromising its structure or finish.

Handling Glue Stains During the Installation of Textile Wallcovering

Always follow the official application instructions when installing your textile wallcovering. Proper handling ensures a flawless finish and prevents issues like glue stains. Follow these additional guidelines to manage glue application and address any accidental glue stains:

1. Apply Glue to the Wall, Not the Backing

Always apply glue directly to the wall, not to the non-woven paper backing of the wallcovering. This prevents excessive glue from seeping through the material.

2. Measure the Glue Carefully

Use approximately 1 liter of glue for every 5 square meters of wall surface. Avoid applying too much glue, as excess adhesive can seep out at the seams when the material is pressed into place.

3. Remove Excess Glue Immediately

If glue seeps out at the seams:

- Gently scrape away the excess using the edge of a teaspoon.
- Lightly blot the area with a clean, slightly damp microfiber cloth. Do not rub, as this can spread the glue and damage the material.

4. Address Residual Glue

If glue residue remains visible after blotting:

- Use a hairdryer to dry the glue completely until it hardens.
- Once the glue is dry, gently brush it away with a soft nail brush. Take care not to press too hard to avoid damaging the fabric.
